# Catalytic Fund for TB - Finding missing people with TB



**US \$ 115 million:**

- Matching fund for 12 countries



**Expected outcome:**  
to find **1.5 million**  
**additional people with TB** by the end of 2019



**US \$ 10 million (SI):**

Stop TB & WHO, support the 13 countries in catalyzing their efforts to find missing people with TB, TB/HIV and DR-TB – including through PPM

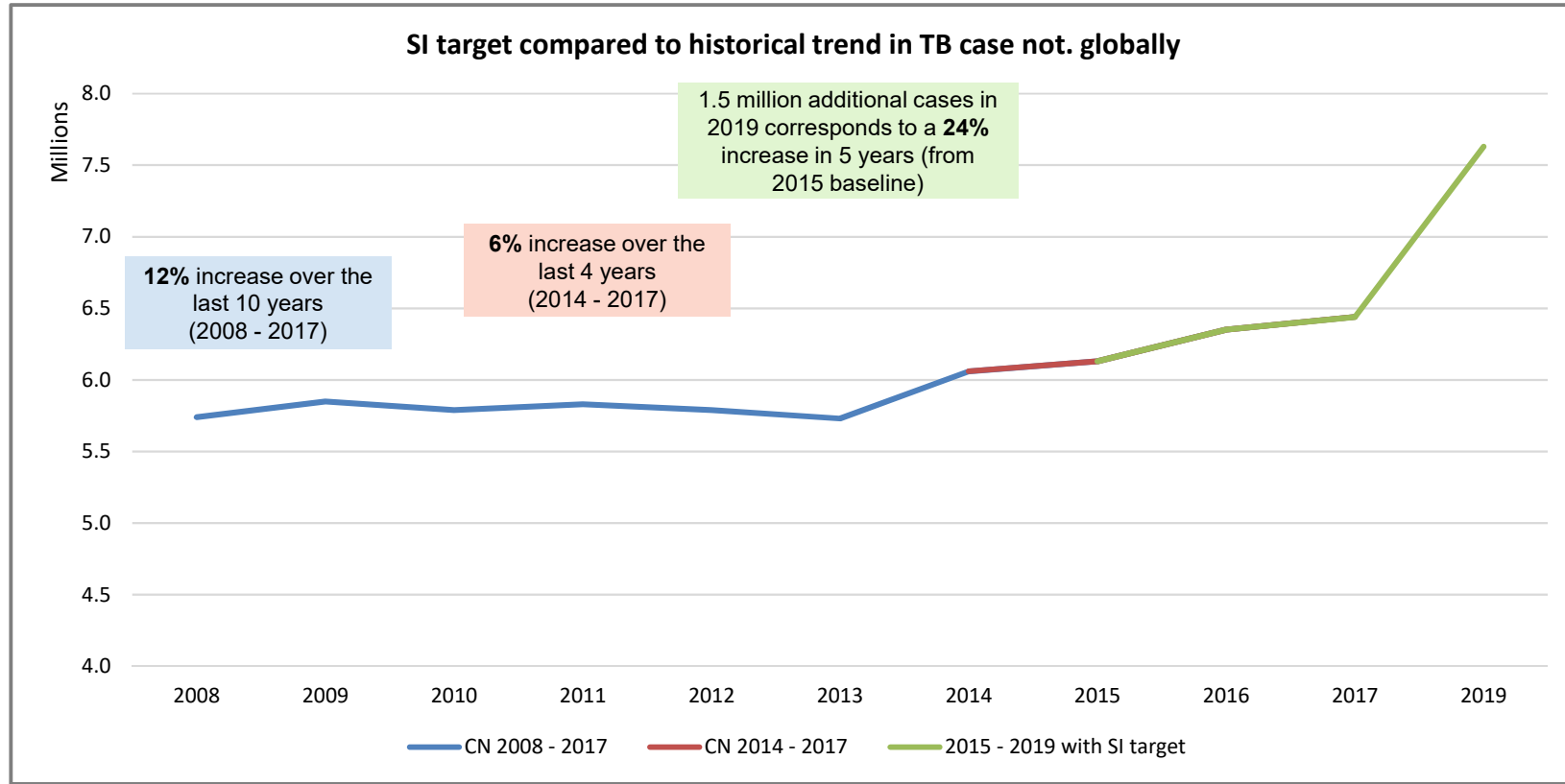

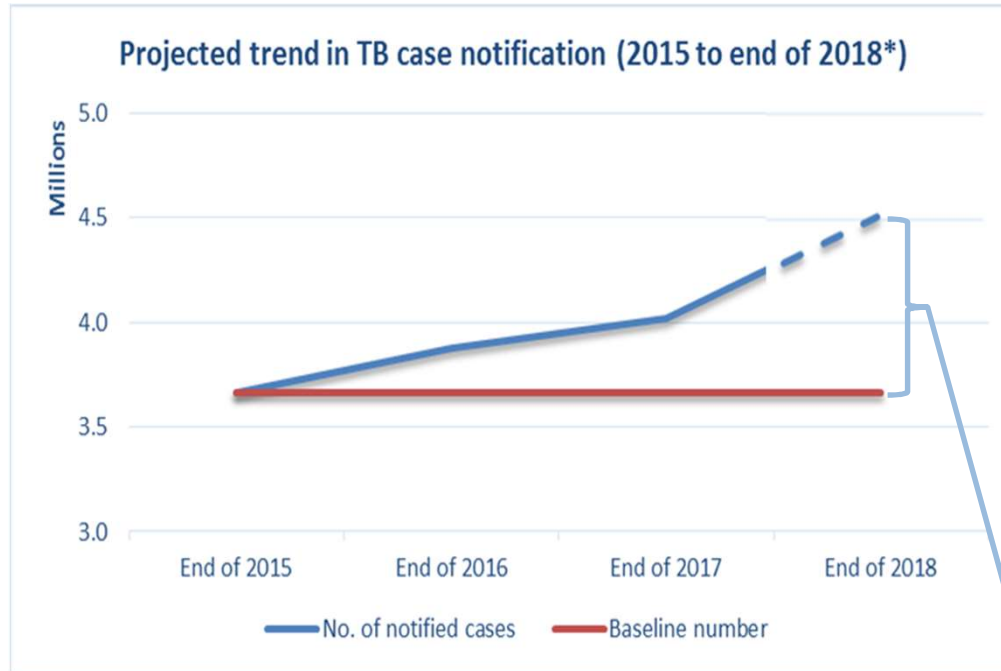

848,000 additional TB cases expected to be notified by the end of 2018

\* Semester 1 (i.e. Q1+Q2) of 2015 and 2017 figures assumed to be half of the annual TB notification

## Conclusion

- TB catalytic funding has set very ambitious targets: double the number of notified cases in 5 years
- Africa is making significant progress but needs to scale up efforts to get it's share of over 260,000 cases and achieve a minimum of 85% of PF targets from the current 79%
- Countries are implementing innovative approaches and best practices which need to be adopted and scaled up
- Global Fund will be working with countries and partners to support rapid adoption of new guidelines
